Introduction

Digital payments are transforming our monetary and financial systems. Over the last decade, new technologies such as Distributed Ledger Technology (DLT) and smart contracts have introduced a radically new way of thinking about enabling monetary and financial transactions. At the same time, new start-ups (so-called FinTechs) and well-established BigTech firms have increasingly ventured into offering new payment services and methods to their customers. Even central banks have realised that they need to rethink their role at the apex of the monetary system and are preparing for the introduction of a fully digital representation of their existing official currencies.

The academy provides a thorough introduction to the topic of digital payments, from the technological foundations and the current trends to the emerging regulation of the modern payments space and the future of payments. Participants will engage in interactive lectures, conduct case studies and mediated group discussions and discuss with experts and policymakers the defining trends in this area. More specifically, the academy will cover various topics such as cryptocurrencies, new approaches to payments offered by FinTechs, Central Bank Digital Currencies (CBDCs) and innovations for cross-border payments. It will focus mostly – but not exclusively – on an EU context and combine insights from various perspectives such as economics, law, regulation and corporate business cases.
